Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, December 28, 2025

From the Desk of the Pastor:

On the last Sunday of the year, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Today we are invited to offer our own families and all the members on the altar for God's blessing.

Ben Sirach in the first reading has many good things to say about living properly according to Torah. Sirach reminds children of their duty to honor their parents – even when it becomes difficult. He also mentions the two-fold reward which God promises to those who honor their father and mother. The first reward is “riches,” and the second long life: “Whoever reveres his father will live a long life.” He reminds children how God blesses them if they obey, revere, and show compassion to their father.

Paul in the letter to the Colossians advises us that we should put on love and remain thankful in our relationships with one another. Paul's advice is part of the "Household code" – the rules for members of the Christian family. Though it is dated, belonging to Paul's time in its details, the underlying message of being careful with one another – being full of care – is timeless. Paul teaches that children should learn and practice noble qualities like compassion, kindness, forgiveness and sharing in the warmth of the family. In a truly holy family all members are respected, cherished, nurtured, and supported, united through the bond of love.

Today's gospel describes how Joseph and Mary protected the Child Jesus from the sword of King Herod by escaping with Him to Egypt.


